Awards: Six place-ribbons are awarded for each class, except Critique. Champion & Reserve are awarded by level. Champion & Reserve will be awarded to horse/rider combinations at Introductory, Training, First, Second Level & above, Eventing and Western, if there are **three or more qualifiers for the level/division**. Horse/rider combinations must have at least two scores at the level to qualify for Champion & Reserve. Scores from Critique Class will be averaged with regular dressage test scores of the same level.

Year End Awards: To qualify for Peninsula Dressage Year End Awards, you must be a member of Peninsula Dressage, volunteer for at least 10 hours prior the end of the show season, and have at least 5 scores from at least 3 shows/judges at Peninsula Schooling shows.

Peninsula Dressage Schooling Show Classes **A horse may be entered in no more than 3 tests if riding training level or above; no limit at Intro; only one Critique class at any level**

USDF Introductory Level: Test A, B or C. You may designate Novice Rider for this level if applicable.

Training Level: Test 1, 2 or 3 First Level: Test 1, 2 or 3 Second Level: Test 1, 2 or 3 Third Level: Test 1, 2 or 3 Fourth Level: Test 1, 2 or 3

Critique Class: Specify Discipline, Level and Test. The judge will give a short (approximately 10 minute) lesson after your test. Ribbons are not awarded, but scores count towards show Champion & Reserve, and Year-End Awards. The fee for this class is \$25; make sure you purchase a Critique 'ticket' online.

Dressage Sport Horse in Hand

Leadline: Test A, or B; specify Test on entry form.
Freestyle: Specify Discipline and Level on entry form
Dressage for Eventers: Specify Level and Test on entry form.
Western Dressage: Specify Level and Test on entry form.

RULES: USEF rules for dressage (https://www.usef.org/compete/disciplines/dressage/rules--equipment) apply. If you have questions, please ask a show manager. Please be aware of **USEF rule DR. 120.1.1** which states:

"Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place."

Novice, Junior and Vintage Classes: Riders may register as Novice, Junior or Vintage Riders when entering the show. They will be scheduled in the appropriate classes according to the tests they are riding (if a designated Junior rider is riding Training 2, s/he will be scheduled in the regular Training 2 class). If there are enough riders in the class, they may be pinned separately at the show manager's discretion. Generally, there must be at least three non-age designated riders <u>and</u> at least three Novice, Junior, or Vintage riders to split the class. Otherwise, Juniors, Novice and Vintage will be pinned together with all other entries in the class.

Definition of a Junior Rider: Riders are Juniors up to and throughout the year in which they turn 18. The following year, they are considered Seniors. Example: if Jane Doe turns 18 on July 7, 2022, she competes as a Junior throughout 2022. Beginning January 1, 2022, she competes as a Senior.

Definition of a Novice Rider: Any Rider showing at the Introductory Level who has never shown ABOVE that Level is a Novice Rider (in any Dressage Division including Western Basic or Dressage or Eventers Starter). **Definition of a Vintage Rider:** Any rider 40 or older at the time of the show.
