USEF rules for dressage apply; know them. Any questions? Ask the show manager. USEF approved helmets with harnesses are mandatory for Juniors. Hard hats must be worn by all riders at all times when mounted, except FEI levels.

Year End Awards: To qualify for Peninsula Dressage Year End Awards, you must be a member of Peninsula Dressage, volunteer for at least 10 hours prior the end of the show season, and have at least 5 scores from at least 3 different judges at Peninsula Schooling shows.

Definition of a Junior Rider: Riders are Juniors up to and throughout the year in which they turn 18. The following year, they are considered Seniors. Example: if Jane Doe turns 18 on July 7, 2022, she competes as a Junior throughout 2022. Beginning January 1, 2022, she competes as a Senior.

Definition of a Vintage Rider: Any rider 40 or older at the time of the show.

Junior and Vintage Classes: Riders may register as Junior or Vintage Riders when entering the show. They will be scheduled in the appropriate classes according to the tests they are riding (if a designated junior rider is riding Training 2, he/she will be scheduled in the regular Training 2 class). If there are enough riders in the class, they may be pinned separately at the show manager's discretion. Generally, this will mean there must be at least three non-age designated riders <u>and</u> at least three Junior or three Vintage riders to split the class. Otherwise, Juniors and Vintage will be pinned together with all other entries in the class.

Awards

Six place-ribbons are awarded for each class, except Critique. Champion & Reserve are awarded by level. Champion & Reserve will be awarded to horse/rider combinations at Introductory, Training, First, Second Level & above, Eventing, and Western, **if** there are **three or more qualifiers for the level/division**. Horse/rider combinations must have at least two scores at the level to qualify for Champion & Reserve. Scores from Critique Class will be averaged with regular dressage test scores of the same level.

Peninsula Dressage Schooling Show Classes

<u>A horse may be entered in no more than 3 tests if riding training level or above;</u> <u>no limit at Intro; only one Critique class at any level</u>

Dressage Sport Horse in Hand USDF Introductory Level: Novice Rider (never shown at Training Level or above); Test A, B or C USDF Introductory Level; Test A, B or C Training Level: Test 1, 2 or 3 First Level: Test 1, 2 or 3
Second Level & Above: specify Level and Test 1, 2 or 3 on entry form
Freestyle: Specify level on entry form
Critique Class: Specify Level and Test on entry form. The judge will give a short (approximately 10 minute) lesson after your test. Ribbons are not awarded, but scores count towards show Champion & Reserve, and Year-End Awards.

Dressage for Eventers: Test of choice; exhibitor must supply two blank test sheets for each test to be ridden. Leadline: Contact show manager if interested.

Western Dressage: Test of choice; exhibitor must supply two blank test sheets for each test to be ridden.
